

NSEW Event Awards rules

1. Entry to the awards is free and open to UK residents only.
2. Only one entry per person/organisation.
3. Entry is via the online entry form only.
4. Entry forms should be completed with all relevant information. Incomplete entry forms will not be accepted.
5. Entry forms should be submitted by midday on 6th February 2012.
6. By entering an event for the awards, you agree that details of this event can appear on The British Science Association website.
7. All entries must register their event at www.britishscienceassociation.org/nsew to be eligible for an award
8. EngineeringUK and the British Science Association may also use the entry on the related internet sites, on television and in print to promote the Awards and NSEW.
9. It is the responsibility of the entrant to inform The British Science Association of any change to their contact details. Failure to do so may result in the entrant not receiving notification of results or similar correspondence.
10. Subject experts, appointed by The British Science Association, will conduct the rounds of judging.
11. All the entries will be included in an initial round of judging, after which fifteen finalists (three in each of the five categories) will be visited in person and judged during the week by the same panel of judges and, subject to a moderation process, one winners and one runner-up will be chosen from each category.
12. The judges' decisions are final at each stage of the process and no appeals will be heard or correspondence, relating to result determination, entered into.
13. The 3 events in each category that have successfully made it to the second round of judging will be announced on the 20th February 2012. These events will then be visited by an Event Award Judge during the Week to allow the final decision on the winner.
14. The winners will be announced after NSEW.
15. A full list of prize winners will be published on The British Science Association website and in any other publications selected by the organisers.
16. The five event award winners and five event award runners-up will each receive a cash prize for their organisation to run subsequent science and engineering based events, e.g. for NSEW 2012. The winners of the event award categories will win £600, with the runners-up receiving £200.
17. All winners, runners-up and finalists will have details of their events featured on the British Science Association website
18. All winners, runners-up, finalists and highly-commended entries agree to submit a short case-study and photo of their event post NSEW for inclusion on the British Science Association website.
19. By entering, entrants will be deemed to have agreed to be bound by these rules.
20. The British Science Association reserves the right to revise these rules and regulations at any time. Should it be necessary to do so, The British Science Association will make every effort to communicate any changes to interested parties as quickly as possible.
